Sources

The following are the sources used to obtain land ownership information detailed in this study of early landowners of Cook Twp.:

1. A preliminary warrantee connected draft map of Cook Township, Westmoreland County, Pa. received May 1993 from the Pa. State Archives. This map outlined tracts including survey number. Warrantee survey information was then read by this author from microfilm roll 28 series located at the Pa. State Archives in Harrisburg.
2. Westmoreland County Map Maintenance Dept. tax maps with overlays of warrants and patents produced from county records by Jerry Wandling. Surveys referenced here refer to Westmoreland County Survey Books.
3. Deeds and estate information found in the Westmoreland County Recorder of Deeds Office and Register of Wills Office.
4. The Campbell and Eakman genealogical studies by Herbert Eckman.
6. Donna Bingham Munger, Pa. Land Records: A History and are located in the Recorder of Deeds office in Westmoreland County. Surveys beginning with the letter C, A, or D refer to survey books made by the Proprietors or the Commonwealth and are available at the Pa. State Archives in Harrisburg.

Early Landowners of the Ligonier Valley Cook Twp. Area

The heirs of William Penn, sons Thomas and Richard, made the The Purchase of 1768 from the Indians at Fort Stanwix (Rome, N.Y.). This purchase was the last made by the Penn proprietary government. It extended the western boundry of lands legally open for settlement to the Ohio and Allegheny rivers. Squatters were already occupying the land; some before and most by the end of the French and Indian War in 1763. The Ligonier Valley, being part of the "New Purchase" area (also called "the Purchase of 1768"), was not officially opened for settlement by the Penn Proprietors until 3 April 1769. Settlers could apply for a maximum of 300 acres at a price of 5# sterling per 100 acres. Some settlers had been granted land by the Commandant of Fort Ligonier, Arthur St. Clair, such as Frederick Rohrer. Most settlers, however, were there without any official sanction.

These "New Purchase Applications" are listed in the New Purchase Register available on film at the Pa. State Archives. If the applicant completed a survey and paid for his land, a "warrant to accept" was completed in his name and he will be listed in the warrant register of the county of jurisdiction at the date of the warrant. The warrant could be dated several years after the date of the application; consequently the county of jurisdiction may have changed. If someone else paid for the land, a "warrant to accept" was completed in the new owners name and that person will be listed in the warrant register as the warrantee.

New Purchase applicants usually did not complete the patenting process or even get a survey because the requirement to pay for the land within one year after the survey was not enforced so there seemed no reason to begin the patenting process.

Early settlers with no titles and holders of grants and applications often sold their property rights without ever going thru the formal titling procedure of warrants, surveys, and patents because of little pressure from the Proprietors to do so and the oncoming Revolutionary War. Bills of Sale and deeds to property were used and most of the time they were recorded in the county allowing chain of ownership to be followed.

The new Commonwealth of Pennsylvania divested the Penn family of their land in 1779. As a result, most titling was done after the end of the Revolutionary War. The Commonwealth Land Office opened in 1781 but it wasn't until 1785 when the new Loan Office was established that settlers were able to pay for their land with a new mortgage plan. Our Cook Twp area seems to have had most of its land surveyed at this time.

Bedford County was created 1771 to cover the western part of the "New Purchase" area. Fairfield Twp. of Bedford County covered the Ligonier Valley between the Laurel Mountains and the Chestnut Ridge with the northern boundry the Conemaugh River and the southern boundry the Youghiogheny River. With the creation of Westmoreland County in 1773 this area became Fairfield Twp north of the Loyalhanna River and Donegal Twp.

south of it. Ligonier Twp was created 1822 from Fairfield and Donegal and the present Cook Twp. was created 1855 from Donegal Twp.

1. The area encompassed by the surveys C29-22, C42-42, C83-175, and C42-71 could be called Cornelius Campbell country. Cornelius Campbell (c1714-1784) per DB 2-512 received a warrant in year 1768 for 400 acres. His son, James Finny Campbell, lived here until his death in 1818. Wm. E. Campbell, son of James Finny Campbell, lived here and died 1831.

C83-175 Warranted by heirs of Wm. E. Campbell in 1838 estate partition, Pn 6-229, this 72 ac north central portion went to son, George E. Campbell, who married Rose Gettemy.

C42-71 Cornelius Campbell, possible son of the original Cornelius Campbell, sold, per DB 11-532, the northwest 72 acres to the original Robert Campbell family. Thomas B. Campbell, son of Robert Campbell, patented the land in 1838.

C42-42 The eastern 100 ac was occupied by the time of the 1798 tax list and warranted 13 Jan 1817 by George Campbell (1767-1835), 2nd son of James Campbell (c1740-1819), warrantee of A10-221. John Campbell Esq., son of George Campbell and Rebecca Ross Ewing, inherited the property per Pn 6-98. When John Campbell, Esq. died 1839, his son, George Campbell Jr. and wife, Catherine, got the land. They sold in 1868 to Wm. Burrell.

C29-22 DB 45-457 made 21 July 1860 between Samuel Roadman and Leonard Roadman gives a good history of the south 133 ac. Warrant #496 was issued for 100 ac including an improvement on 24 Mar 1820 to Thomas & Wm. Campbell, administrators of the estate of James Finny Campbell. Land adjoined lands of James McClane, John Eakman, Jacob Brugh, Wm. E. Campbell, and James Campbell. Patented 11 March 1824, the administrators conveyed the property on 4 June 1824 to Wm. Hood. Wm. Hood and wife, Catherine sold to Jacob Leighteberger that same month. Leighteberger heirs then sold to Wm. Leighteberger and Thomas and Eve Felgar in 1834. In 1836 the property was sold to Zebulon Moore and wife, Lydia. In 1852 they sold it to Samuel Roadman.

2. Surveys C72-277, C72-270, and A58-171 encompass an area that could be called Robert Campbell country.

C72-277 Robert Campbell Sr. (c1730-c1800) was here by 1771. This land was the scene of the 1775 massacre of his family by Indians. Indian captive Robert Campbell (1758-1857), son of the above Robert, gave part of this land, now called Pleasant Grove, to the Old Donegal Church and was the church's most celebrated elder. He married Hannah Galbreath, daughter of John Galbreath, who made his will in 1800.

C72-270 Warranted 1786 by George Glen and Alex'r Johnston and patented 1838 by Robert Campbell. DB 46-132, made 1860, names daughters of Robert

Campbell (1758-1857): Sarah, Isabella, and Rachel, that married John and Robert Guffy and Peter Phillippi.

A58-171 Surveyed per warrant to Robert Magee (McGaw?) 13 Sep 1784 who sold to Joseph Campbell 15 Sep 1785. Joseph Campbell then sold the property in 1799 to Martin Criley. In 1815 Criley deeded to Matthias Marker. 100 ac of this area was purchased by Robert Campbell at a Sheriff's auction in 1810.

3. The area enclosed by surveys C178-148, C124-263, C37-155, and C99-267 can be called William Campbell country.

C178-148 and C124-263 William Campbell (c1720-c1800) of Straban Twp., York County, Pa., purchased this area in 1775 from Michael Cauffman per DB C-200. Survey C78-148 notes that the land was obtained by Michael Coffman by order # 3038 dated 13 Apr 1769. The east 225 acres was warranted per C124-263 in 1785 by John McGaw. John Galbreath is on the westerly 140 ac. and John McGaw on the east 100 ac. in 1798 U.S. Census. Westmoreland County survey 1-92c shows the west 135 acres surveyed to John Galbreath in 1798.

C37-155 and C99-267 Survey A10-221 made in 1786 notes that this land is William Campbell's. Survey C99-267 for 101 acres shows a Wm. Hamilton warrant in 1786 and survey made 1787. The 21 acres per survey C37-155 warranted by Wm Campbell is probably Wm. G. Campbell, first son of the original James Campbell, who warranted the above survey A10-221. This first son of James, Wm. G. Campbell, died 1851. This area is part B of his 1851 estate partition Pn7-503. The property went to his son, Wm. Campbell (1800-1886).

4. A10-221 James Campbell (c1740-1819), herein assumed son of Wm. Campbell (c1720-c1800) warranted this area 20 Mar 1786 paying interest from 1773. It was patented 1 June 1836 by his sons, James and Robert. The northern 1/3 went to son, "Captain" Robert Campbell (1778-1854). His estate, Pn 8-283, gives this 1/3 to son, White Campbell, and daughter, Sarah Campbell, who married her cousin, James S. Campbell. The southern 1/3 went to son Wm. G. Campbell (1763-1850). His estate per Pn 7-503 gives the area to sons, Jesse and James. The middle 1/3 of the original James Campbell area was sold to Henry Sible and Martin Minsee per DB 96-635.

5. William Eakman area: The 313 acre area enclosed by the John Eakman survey C51-102 on the west, James McLain's 105 ac in the center, and the James McKenzie survey C136-196 on the east is shown as James Guffy property per DB C-200 made 1775, William Eakman, on this area by 1784, was one of the bondsmen on the estate of Cornelius Campbell who died 1784. Wm. Eakman died 1790. Pn 3-382 made 1797 includes a survey of this 313 acres. Son, John Eakman, patented the west 104 acres which he sold in 1825 to Jacob Felfer. The 105 ac parcel marked Mariah Campbell (who purchased it 1874) was owned by James McClean in 1825 who later sold to Jacob Roadman. Also apparently sold by Eakman to McClean was the easterly 81 ac that was in 1822 warranted by James McKenzie, husband of Agnes Campbell, daughter of James Campbell (1740-1819). Part of the town of Mansville (C143-80) was in 1816 taken from this acreage.

6. D17-124 Robert Williams Jr. warranted 300 ac 13 June 1786. Deeded 5 March 1800 to Richard Williams. Richard Williams and wife, Roseann R., sold 200 ac to David Henry 10 Sept 1804 per DB 7-246 and 93 ac to Wm. Gettemy in 1808 per DB 10-253. Pn 7-503 in 1851 shows Wm. G. Campbell owner of 66 acres in the center of this area which went to his son, Alexander Campbell. At that time Michael Cunningham was to the east, James McMurry to the west, and John Hood to the south of this 66 ac.

7. C34-256 This survey made for Alex'r Campbell in 1830 (West. Co. 1-140a) shows Robert E. Campbell on southeast, Robert C. Campbell on the northwest, Wm. G. Campbell on the southwest, Matthias Marker on the east, and John Campbell, Esq. on the west.
8. C26-252 John Campbell, 4th son of James Campbell (c1740-1819) warranted 26 Feb 1800 with interest from 1 March 1798. Alexander Campbell, 5th son of the same James Campbell was deeded this land by John Campbell and wife, Elizabeth, in 1813. Alexander and wife, Elizabeth, in 1814 deeded 66 ac to John Young per DB 13-379 & 380. The west part belonged to Wm. Hood per West. Co. survey 2-5a in 1811.
9. C86-90 This 184 ac tract was warranted by Wm Hamilton in 1786. John Campbell, Esq. purchased the southern 83 ac at a Sheriff auction 24 Nov 1827 as the property of Alexander Johnston. Sold by John Campbell, Esq. and wife, Mary Galbreath, on 28 May 1831 to Adam Brant per DB 23-219. Joiners were Capt. Robert Campbell, James Henry, and Wm. Caven.
10. D50-81 Clements Burleigh here c1797 per DB 11-87. "Captain" Robert Campbell shown here on several surveys c1825. "Captain" John Campbell shown following "Captain" Robert. The warrantee, John B. Campbell, "Captain" John. is the son of John, grandson of James, and great grandson fo William Campbell, Sr. (c1720-1800).
11. C83-244 Although the survey shows warrantees as George Hutchinson in 1789 and Wm. L. McClean in 1825a warrant #504 was issued 5 Feb 1825 to Wm. E. Campbell. "who applies for 150 ac where settlement and improvement have been made adjoining lands of Thomas Campbell and John McPeck on the north, James Nelson on the east, heirs of Henry on the south, and (Captain) Robert Campbell on the west". The west 84 ac 128p was surveyed 4 Sep 1837 by the administrators of the estate of Wm. E. Campbell (Pn6-229). The estate gave the property to Cornelius Campbell (1790-1856), oldest son of Wm. E. Campbell. This survey shows William McClean on the east side of the Campbell Run.
12. C170-217 Will of Frederick Rohrer May 1823 made John Felgar his executor who then conveyed the acreage to Jacob Best in 1824. Jacob and Rachel Best in 1827 deeded the property to John Stahl. In 1855 John and Barbara Stahl deeded to Andrew Jackson Stahl (DB39-70).
13. C184-209 DB 15-397: John Campbell (4th son of James Campbell 1740-1819) to Robert Campbell made 13 Jan 1821. This deed conveys half of this tract to Robert Campbell. Deed also reveals patent information on the tract of 297 acres called "Betsy", and notes that John Campbell received the tract April 1816 from Frederick Rohrer.

14. C29-73 Warrant #503 on 4 Feb 1825. "Thomas Campbell (by virtue of an application #2725 on 3 April 1769 by Wm. McKenzy) there has been surveyed a tract of 210 ac 80p in Donegal Twp. Title vested in Thomas Campbell per judgement of the Supreme Court for the Western District of Pa." Paid 5# sterling per 100 ac. Thomas Campbell shown as occupant of this area in several surveys.

15. C53-261 Philemon Waters (per DB A-418 made 9 Oct 1783 recorded 12 Nov 1784) deeds land "on waters of the 4 Mile Run adjoining the dividing ridge on the south betwixt the head waters of the Loyalhanna and 4 Mile Run held by improvement made in 1768 by Philemon Eskins by the leave of Captain St. Clair, commandant of Fort Ligonier, and conveyed from Philemon Eskins to Philemon Waters by Bill of Sale" James Guffy warranted the tract 3 Feb 1785 and patented it 1788. He deeded the tract to John Robeson per DB 7-611 made 4 March 1806.

16. A86-165 and C61-294 Patrick Archibald land. The east 424 ac is shown in survey C61-294 surveyed 25 Feb 1797 in pursuance of a warrant to Wm Gettemy 9 Feb 1787. This tract occupied by Thomas Archibald in 1798 and patented by Thomas Archibald and Mary Ferguson, heirs of Patrick Archibald, in 1814 when 350 ac was sold to Jacob Brugh. The west 438 ac is in survey A86-165 made 4 April 1797 in pursuance of a warrant to Patrick Archibald dated 16 Jan 1797.

17. C60-219 Ephraim Eakman warranted this 151 ac 8 Nov 1814 and patented it 16 Aug 1816. Survey states that no person resided on the land until 28 March 1814. Sold by Ephraim and Jane Eakman to John Kerns on 20 Dec 1816. Ephraim and wife were in Morgan County, Ohio, by 1820.

18. C170-228 This 266 ac was warranted by John Ross 29 June 1773 and surveyed 1801. John Campbell was to the south, James Robinson to the southwest, Patrick Archbold to the north, and Wm. Eakman to the northeast.

Bedford County, formed 9 March 1771 from Cumberland County, provided services to the western part of the new territory that became available for settlement as a result of the Purchase of 1768. Fairfield Twp included the area between the Laurel Hill on the east, Chestnut Ridge on the west, Conemaugh River on the north, and the Youghiogheny River on the south. In 1773 when Westmoreland County was formed from Bedford the area became Fairfield and Donegal townships.
